And now a few words from my foster family:

Charlie came to us after he had surgery for IVDD. He was paralyzed but the surgery was successful, and he has been rehabilitated and walks and runs normally. He is an adorable friendly little guy and very sweet. He really does love a good nap and his favourite thing is to burrow so lots of blankets and beds are a requirement! So far, he has been friendly to everyone he has met while in foster care. He really loves to be close to his people and will follow you around everywhere. He had not been walked outside much while in foster care due to the rehabilitation from IVDD but the short walks he does well on leash. He has potential to be leash reactive to other dogs. When left along with the resident dachshund and samoyed he does not bark and sleeps under his blankets. He could be okay for an apartment but it is unknown how he would

do completely alone with no other dogs. Charlie's new owners will need to be committed to working on housebreaking.

A note on housebreaking - when Charlie is left alone, and we are at work he remains in his xpen due to IVDD and rarely has an accident. He has had most of his accidents near the door when we don't know he is asking to go out. But he will also sneak off and have an accident at times. I think with a consistent schedule and knowing his queues this can be worked on.

Charlie needs a home that understands IVDD and the precautions to take. He is looking for a soft spot to land and live the rest of his senior years with his forever family.
