My foster pawrents are working on my manners when greeting people. If you ignore me until I calm down, then I won't pee with excitement. I haven't had any doggy friends or siblings before. I was introduced to a small, calm dog on a walk, and I was very cautious. I liked touching noses, but I didn't like it when they sniffed my bottom. I love both my foster pawrents, but I get very anxious when they leave the room, especially with my foster dad because I'm a bit of a man's man. I need my future family to be home more often than not, but they will also need to be willing to keep working with me to so that I can learn to be alone sometimes too. I love my crate, so I think I can get there eventually; you will just need to be patient with me. I love going for walks, but my leash manners are also a work in progress. Walks are good for me to help me expend some of my youthful energy... I have lots of it. I like having a backyard and will be happy to keep all the small critters in line. You should also know that I have a very loud bark, and I bark at all the noises. I also love to play with the ball; I will fetch it, but I may not bring it back because I like to play with it once I have it. He gets over stimulated in public settings or if there are too many visitors at one time. Henri isn't a big foodie, however if someone drops food of any kind, the two-second rule applies. He likes to be close to his humans when they eat, and after a few consistent "Henri on your bed" directions, he gives up and will lay down and chill. He sleeps like an angel in his closed crate at night. He needs his first morning pee as soon as he wakes up. Aside from that, he will let you know when he wants to go out by sitting beside the door (once he knows his surroundings). He likes to go outside for pee breaks every 3-4 hours. Henri travels well in the car and would move around if not secured safely. Also, a firm grip is needed when exiting the car; he is very strong and will try and jump out of your arms. They will need to continue to focus on his leash training, teaching him to not jump on people upon greeting them, and his separation anxiety.
